Poor people in Victorian times lived in horrible cramped conditions in run-down houses, often with the whole family in one room. Homes for the middle classes and the upper classes were much better. They were better built and were larger. The houses had most of the new gadgets installed, such as flushing toilets, gas lighting, and inside bathrooms.



For your summer project, you need to do a bit of research on Victorian houses. Once you have gathered enough information, think about designing your own Victorian house. Consider the different rooms that you would expect to find, the rooms' sizes and what furniture they would consist of.
